



Norman James Lindsay

August 15, 1922 - October 19, 2018

LINDSAY- Norman James Lindsay, 96, of Jacksonville passed away at home Friday, Oct. 19, 2018, surrounded by family.

Norman was born August 15, 1922, in Manhattan, New York, the son of Robert and Margaret (Dinsmore) Lindsay. He married Doris Martha Curtis on Nov. 15, 1947, in Hastings, Florida, and she preceded him in death on Jul. 27, 1993. He was remarried to Bonnie Richards on Feb. 12, 1996 in Jacksonville, who survives him. Norman had two older brothers, Chester and Robert Lindsay, and has a younger sister, Dorothy Cautela, who lives in Charleston, SC.

He is survived by two sons and a daughter, Jim (wife, Beth) Lindsay of Hobe Sound, FL, Terry (wife, Barbara) Lindsay of Kearneysville, WV, and Dottie (grand-dog, Basil) Lindsay of Charleston, SC; two stepsons, Steve Richards (wife, Lori) of Jacksonville and Stan Richards (wife, Sharon) of Orlando; seven grandchildren, Brooke (husband, Leo), Ryan (wife, Kris), Megan (husband, Chance), Will (wife, Kat), Katie (husband, Shawn), Emily, and Daniel; three great-grandchildren, Tommy, Myah, and Jackson.

Norman served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, receiving the Asiatic Pacific and Victory Ribbons as well as the Good Conduct Medal. He was employed by the Florida Steel Corporation in Jacksonville from 1951 to 1981 as Sales Manager. He worked for Berman Bros., Inc. in Jacksonville from 1981 until his retirement in 1992. He volunteered at Memorial Hospital for 17 years. Norman was a member of St. Paul United Methodist Church for 55 years. He loved to dance, was a woodworker, golfer, and devoted husband and family man.

A memorial service will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 27, 2018, at St. Paul United Methodist Church, 8264 Lone Star Road, Jacksonville, FL (32277) with interment at the Jacksonville National Cemetery at a future date.
